The above said millage represents a renewal of the millage rate of 35 hundredths of one mill (\$.3500 cents per \$1,000 of taxable valuation, as equalized). The authorization to levy said millage is for a period of four (4) years being 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024. It is estimated that the amount to be generated from the total millage rate in the first year of the levy (2021) will be approximately \$2,888,518.00.
